Forklift training focuses on health and safety issues included in making use of forklifts. Safety issues affect both the operator of the forklift and employees and other people who are near the forklift. Companies could be subject to penalties if they are caught with operators who are un-certified during a check up. There are several compelling reasons why businesses must follow forklift standards.

Nearly all federal, state, and provincial regulations require an employee evaluation of the skills necessary for forklift safety before the employer signs off that the employee is certified. There are numerous ways to obtain forklift training for employees, like for instance online forklift training. However, employers should know that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Correct forklift training must include some areas of study, including theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not need employers to have an outside organization to certify drivers of forklifts.

A quality forklift certification school would include a recommended curriculum which comprises classroom training and hands-on training that is performed on-site. The training sessions inside the classroom incorporate power point presentations, videos, discussions and models. Students normally are needed to write a test to check for subject matter understanding. Certificates of completion are given upon successfully finishing the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation requires the trainee to know the job site dangers, pre-operational machine inspection, operational instruction and a pass/fail operational test.

The following subject areas will usually be covered in the training: Controls & Instrumentations; Understanding legislations and regulations; maneuvering and Steering; Engine Operation and Maintenance; Visibility, Fork & Attachment Restrictions; Rated Capacities, Stability, Maintenance & Inspection; Load Control; Refueling; Pedestrians, and Hazardous Places & Rough Terrain Operation. Also, there are training courses available for workers who are transitioning to new job positions.
